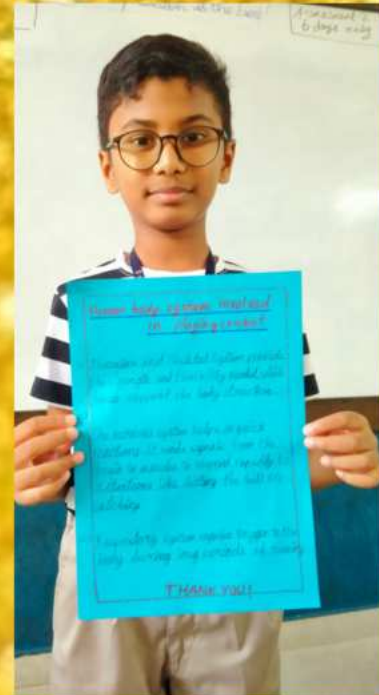

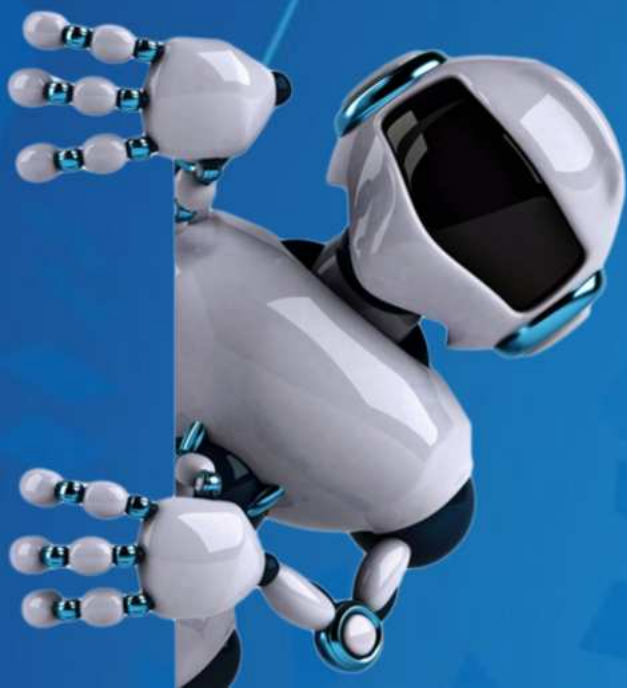
Robotics and SSR SMU
